

### SUMMARY







### TRADE AREA




In 2011, Catalyst created the Primary Trade Area (PTA) for Kyle utilizing over 7,315 unique customer intercepts from the region. These samples were collected various locations, including 10 locations throughout Kyle, including key retailers and various shopping destinations. These samples were geocoded, combined, and analyzed at a targeted capture rate of 70% to define the Primary Trade Area of Kyle using block groups. The results are depicted in the map above, as the **Primary Trade Area** represents a catchment of 68% utilizing the underlying block groups. The **21-minute drive time** is representative of 65.8% catchment, and the **12-mile ring** represents 64.8% catchment. Only samples taken from within Kyle's City limits were utilized to construct the Primary Trade Areas.
